Imagine that you are a journalist who is writing an illustrated article for the magazine “**The Youth of today**” on one of the topics below.

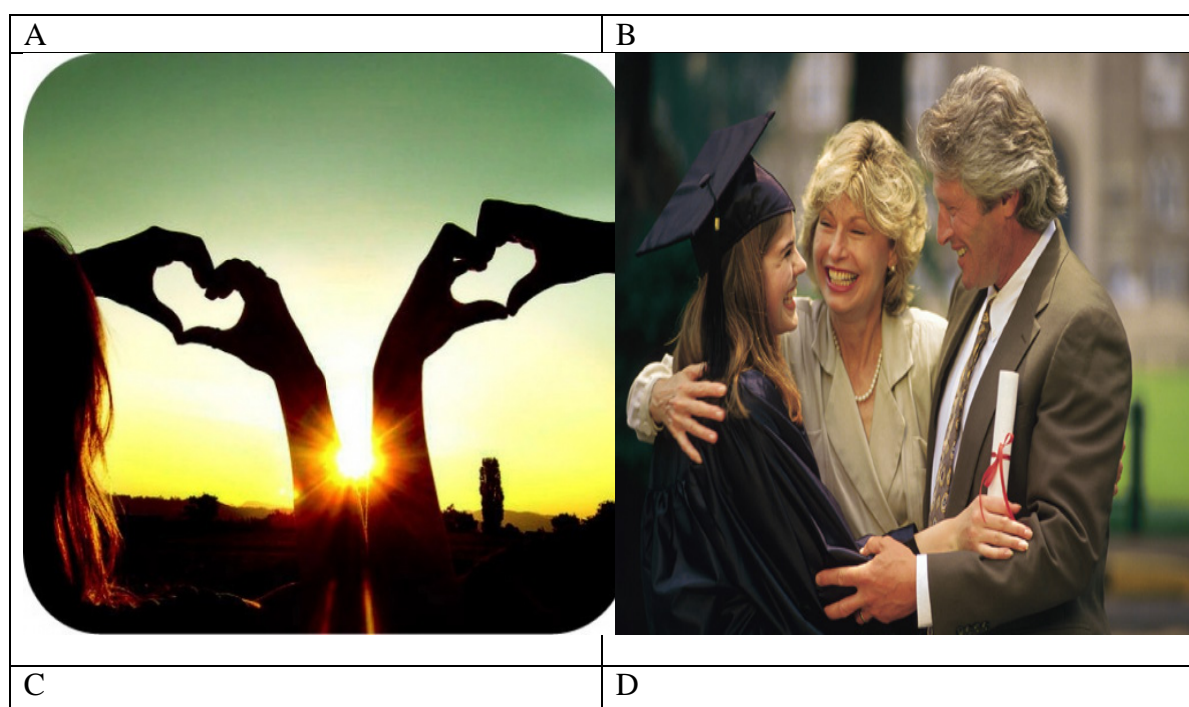
- 1) *Motivation for studying*
