Many people admire the paintings and sculptures that artists create. Some very beautiful paintings and sculptures were created by two men who lived in the same country at the same time. These men were Leonardo da Vinci and Michelangelo. They both lived in Italy around the year 1500.

His Mona Lisa (1503–19) is among the most widely popular and influential paintings of the Renaissance and it is perhaps the best-known painting in the world. It shows the head and shoulders of a dark-haired woman. When people look at this painting, they are often hypnotized by her smile and by her eyes, which have a look of mystery. Another painting of Leonardo's is called The Last Supper. This painting shows a famous scene from the Christian religion. In this painting, Jesus Christ is sitting at the middle of a long table, with his followers (the disciples) sitting around him. Many of the paintings that were created at this time have a religious theme.

Leonardo was not only an artist; he was also interested in engineering. He actually worked for some time as an advisor to a military leader, helping him to develop new machines to use in war. Leonardo also made rough drawings of machines that are similar to those that were invented much later, such as submarines and helicopters. He also sketched some of the city plans and topographical maps, creating early examples of the aspects of modern cartography. Obviously, Leonardo was an extremely creative man.
